His first production with them was in the 2004 production of *Hobsons Choice* for which he was nominated for an ATG Best Actor award. Since then, he has continued to be very active in theatre. His other Stirling productions are: *Outside Edge* (2007-Director), *One Flew Over the Cuckoos Nest* (2010), *Scenes from a Separation* (2011), *God of Carnage* (2013), *Our Country's Good* (2016), *Rosencrantz and Guildenstern are Dead* (2018), *The Hypochondriac* (2021), *Amy's View* (2022-Director) and *Speaking in Tongues* (2023).

Other productions Time has enjoyed are: *The Darling Buds* of May (2014 - Therry), When the Rain Stops Falling (2016 – St Judes), The White House Murder Case (2017 – Red Phoenix), The Diary of Anne Frank (2017 Adelaide Rep), Things I Know to be True (2019 – St Judes) and directing Skylight in 2021 for Verendus Theatrical.
